



WorkingRite: Trustee Positions

What we do

WorkingRite helps disadvantaged 16-19 year olds into jobs, apprenticeships or purposeful learning. We support young people through the crucial transition from adolescence to adulthood by equipping them with the skills, experience and confidence to secure and maintain a job. Our unique work-based learning and mentoring programme involves individually matching young people to small or medium sized businesses in their local community for three to six months. Each young person is taught on-the-job by a workplace mentor and supported throughout by a local Project Co-ordinator. 62% of all the young people who start the WorkingRite programme progress to positive destinations – and for the vast majority who complete the course, over 80% secure full-time jobs or apprenticeships. WorkingRite operates across different areas of Scotland.
